20. Cats throw up twice their body weight when dizzy.

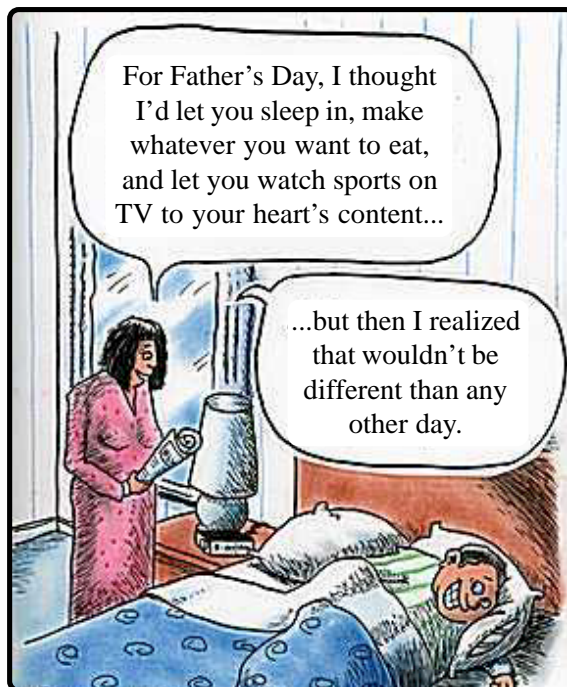


Kids and Their Thoughts...
