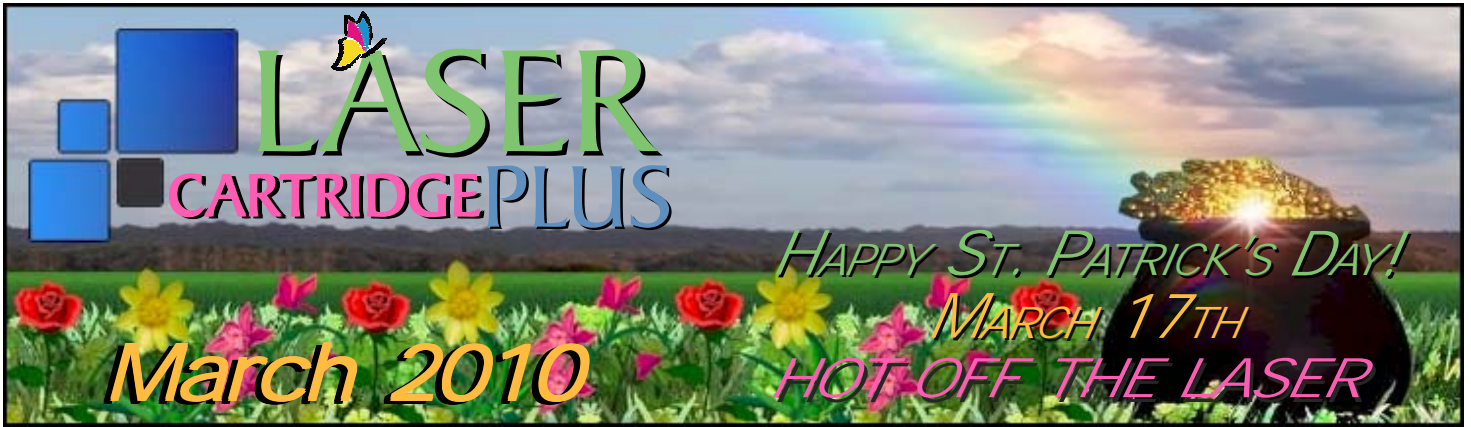
Random Thoughts...
